Reflections with Fr. Uju 5th Sunday of Easter, Yr. B

The message of the Gospel today speaks of the vine and the branches. It also speaks of the vine grower. The mystery of the relationship in these readings is that the branches hold the fruit, the vine is the conduit that provides the nourishment, and the vine grower is the one who expects the fruit from the branches for which there will be praise or blame. The translation of this relationship with us as believers is that Jesus is the vine, we are the branches, and God is the vine grower. Last week we spoke of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. Part of the work of the Good Shepherd is the provision of nourishment for the flock. Jesus provides us with nourishment so that our lives can grow to bear fruit. If we cannot produce the needed fruit it will not be because we are starved but maybe because of an internal condition as happens in a diseased branch—should we then be cut off and thrown away as fit for nothing? Well, the work of God the Father was not only about cutting off the branch from the vine, but it also includes the act of pruning; and it's done for the bearing of more fruit. So, it is always about bearing fruit since we all share in the nurturing milk of the Church—the Body of Christ. Unfortunately, many of us do not think that the value of our Christian vocation is seen in fruitfulness and so we are careless with our lives and opportunities. So, it is always better for us to ask ourselves, how are we bearing fruit for God in the affairs of everyday life? One thing that stands out clearly is the panacea for this greater fruitfulness which comes from the pruning power of the Father by the words of Scripture. This means that no ministerial fruitfulness is possible without the word of God. The values of pruning are to hold together the different parts of the tree, to become more beautiful, as well as create that allowance for greater fruitfulness. These are among the generous values contained in the Scripture which is offered to all of us. May we all accept it and allow it to do its work in us.

If you were sexually abused by any person or entity connected with the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore (also known as the Archdiocese of Baltimore), a Roman Catholic parish or Roman Catholic school within the geographical area of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Baltimore or have any claim against the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore, you must file a claim by May 31, 2024. If you fail to file a timely claim, you may lose the right to assert a claim at a later date.
