6th Sunday of Easter, Yr. B, Reflection with Fr. Uju

One thing the Scripture today brings to our attention is that faith is a gift that celebrates God's first intervention. Jesus says: "you did not choose me, I chose you . . ." this means that conversion is a response to divine first move. Equally, that passage tells us that God's choice is for a purpose, which He commands by saying go and bear fruit. And in the journey of bearing fruit, one's love is demonstrated to the point of giving up oneself to serve God's purpose. That was what Jesus did when He paid the ultimate price. Many of the Apostles did the same and many believers throughout history had paid the price. For many of us the opportunity of paying this type of price will never come because we live in a culture that is presumed Christian and one in which many respect other rights to be. Thank God. And as you celebrate this remember that there are many Christians in some parts of the world who don't share this privilege that we have. Pray for them, remembering that Christians are the most persecuted religious group in the world. In all, we should not forget the call of Jesus reminding us always that we are chosen for a purpose. Peter responded to His choice and was attentive to its demand. He went to the house of Cornelius led by the Spirit, and there refused homage when Cornelius offered it. He realized more clearly that God had no favorites but pours His Spirit abundantly on all who fear Him. You are one of those chosen to go and bear fruit. Last week we reflected on the fact that our fruitfulness is only possible when we are connected to Jesus the vine who nourishes and prunes us with the power of His words and sacraments. It was also shown that the horizontal connectedness with the faith community cannot be ignored in the work of Christian fruitfulness. As God nourishes us He goes ahead of us watering the ground of evangelization by preparing people to be docile to the Spirit. How many of such people have you discovered, and did you take the chance offered by God for your own Christian fruitfulness?

In re: Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore Case No. 23-16969

If you were sexually abused by any person or entity connected with the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore (also known as the Archdiocese of Baltimore), a Roman Catholic parish or Roman Catholic school within the geographical area of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Baltimore or have any claim against the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore, you must file a claim by May 31, 2024. If you fail to file a timely claim, you may lose the right to assert a claim at a later date.
