Reflections On Pentecost by: Fr. Uju

The symbolism of today's solemnity is so great that it is not just a feast of the birthday of the Church but the birthday of a new nation of people called to go everywhere proclaiming the good things God has done. It is most importantly necessary for us to reflect on what Jesus said in the gospel about how much he needed to tell the Apostles only that it would be much for them now; but that when the Spirit comes, He would lead them to the complete truth. The Scriptures make us know too, that the Holy Spirit is the spirit of power that comes to wake up the sleeping mind so that it goes on to do great works. But no matter our perception of the Holy Spirit, it is the form of God's abiding presence with us now as Jesus promised when He informed the Apostles that He was not going to leave them as orphans. A little thought about Jesus and His Disciples showed the courage they had with Him around, the confidence they developed knowing that He will defend them, and the assurance that with him they will not lack. For this, they were able to "leap like antelopes" but with Jesus physically gone from their sight, they needed another source of courage, another companion whose presence will lead them to continue to do great things. The Holy Spirit is that companion given to them, as well as to you and me in our Christian journey, so that we may not feel alone and afraid to carry out the mission given to us. That mission is to proclaim the Good News throughout the world. We saw its power at work on the First Pentecost and we pray for a new Pentecost for all members of the Church. However, the glossolalia experience of that day has led many Christians to associate speaking in tongues as the sole evidence of the presence of the Spirit. Not really. **Those tongues communicated one message;** and we know today that there are more than one way of communication. The message of that day, and which still stands, is the mighty works of God and our hope of salvation in Christ. Therefore, any way you are able to do this is your tongue and you have to use it boldly so that through you others may know what the Lord has done for us. Please help us to pray for our members of the Holy Ghost Congregation (Spiritans), that we may be ever renewed and invigorated for the mission of Christ especially where the church has the greatest needs. Thanks.

If you were sexually abused by any person or entity connected with the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore (also known as the Archdiocese of Baltimore), a Roman Catholic parish or Roman Catholic school within the geographical area of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Baltimore or have any claim against the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore, you must file a claim by May 31, 2024. If you fail to file a timely claim, you may lose the right to assert a claim at a later date.
