21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

The encounter between Jesus and the many people who initially surged towards Him for material food came to its crescendo in the event we heard in the Gospel today. The people felt that the message Jesus was offering that His flesh is real food, and His blood real drink was so intolerable that no one will accept it. Well, it turned out to be a fallacy of overgeneralization because there were some people who accepted it. What is important for our reflection however is that many left and stopped following Jesus; and Jesus did not plead with them to return, nor did He stay to make clarification as He is used to in the other Bible instances when people don't understand His message. He was so direct with the message that He turned to the Disciples to ask if they too will not leave. All these weeks, we have been reflecting on the Eucharistic discourses. Last week we reflected on the necessity of the Holy Eucharist for all who seek the true life and want to be raised up on the last day. Therein we emphasized that the eucharist is no ordinary food but Jesus himself who seeks a relationship with us in all the forms of our Eucharistic encounters. But this not imposed encounter is neither compromised—it is given to those who accept knowing that Jesus has the message of eternal life. So, our presentation of this sacrament as a Church must respect peoples choices, not to accept it and more importantly not to compromise the seriousness of it because someone wants to receive it in his or her own way. The Eucharist we learn today is the point of no apologies and compromises for Jesus, for the early Church, and for us. It is sad that many leave the Catholic church thinking that the Church's teaching about the Eucharist is hard and discriminatory. It is more sad that some others let their disagreement with other aspects of church life make them walk away from the church and the Eucharist. Don't be among them. Rather let your desire for eternal life and the nourishment for it be your drive to keep your weekly appointment with Jesus. Fr. Uju
