24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Most people today seek praises, affirmation and honor; and cannot bear even the least rebuke. Although no one enjoys being rebuked but most people in their life's journey meet with praises and rebukes at different times depending on what they have done, good or not so good. Today the Gospel shows us the affirmation of Peter when he was able to speak out his knowledge of Jesus; and his rebuke when his perception of the ministry of Jesus contradicted divine will. This tells us to be open to accept and work-through our praises and rebukes in life depending on our words or actions at the time. However, the message of today is in the question of who Jesus is. The ancient philosopher, Socrates, was said to have uttered that "the unexamined life is not worth living." Various traditions of spirituality encourage times of meditation for adherents to examine where they are and where they are going. Even people in the corporate world call for retreats and visioning for them to examine or re-examine where they are going from where they are. It comes as no surprise that Jesus had to pose this question to His followers. He asks us the same question and from that encounter we understand that the good opinions of people about Jesus are incomplete unless they include the knowledge of Him as Messiah and Son of God. We live in an age when many think that they love and adore Jesus, but they do not go the extra mile to know Jesus in His full authenticity. The question then is: do you know Jesus as this or as something else? Equally, are you able to match your knowledge of Jesus with every acceptance that God's will prevail so that you are not called Satan? To know Jesus as the Christ includes accepting his redemptive suffering for our salvation; and to know ourselves as Christians includes accepting that life is not always a bed of roses. We are also brought to realize that no matter what we know of Jesus and how close we are with him, the devil can still come to make us turn away.
