25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

When a business is planning to close down, many in the business try undoing each other for who takes what away. Also, many families have crumbled that once were strong when the Patriarch or Matriarch dies because the children were fighting on how to share the property or how they will undo each other in the way of appropriating one thing or the other. This human trait equally finds its way into the Spiritual Community. I'm sure with the certainty of church closure the desire to take one thing or the other away, as belonging to so and so, may disrupt longtime friendship. The some **Apostolic** Community found themselves in that age-old instinct which had been seen between Esau and Jacob about getting a blessing from their dying father. Jesus was still talking about his death, and unfortunately the apostles were not feeling with Him. They were not concerned about what implication that has on them. They never thought of how they would go on without the Lord who was all things for them. Rather, they were thinking about who will be in charge, who was the greatest among them. Is there any wonder that modern society has established the concept of a Will. In my native Language we say that "if the dead shares out his property, the living will re-apportion it." This is because we know that sometimes people can issue wills like Herod because they were feeling merry for one thing or the other. When good (common) sense steps in, people can make the best of the future to advance the common good and project. But in the Body of Christ that common sense begins with the notion that Jesus wants all to be great; and in His Kingdom all can be great at the same time if and only if they begin from the rungs of service. Greatness is not measured by the number of people you outwit but on the number of people you reach out to and lift up in Jesus name. Fr. Uju
