26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's message holds several themes that can be reflected on such as, collaboration in ministry, the power of the Holy Spirit to blow where it wills, and the seriousness of sin. The commission of the seventy elders as advised by Moses' father-in-law was to develop a body of helpers for Moses who was seen to be over-stretching himself to minister to the people. Like in that story, though, it is God who gives the power, yet it is a share in the power of the minister. Therefore, that biblical passage asks each of the persons in the ministries of the Church whose spirit they share in or if they are there for their own agenda—something we reflected on last week as the foundation of all the problems and scandals the church has faced throughout history. On the other hand, it queries the leaders who will adversely try to stop any ministry just because they don't understand it to remember the words of Moses, how he wished all God's children were prophets. It tells us not to quench the spirit just as it tells the "possessed of the Spirit' to know that they are sharers in a ministry and not givers of the ministry. Furthermore, we hear of the seriousness of sin that is hinged on the desirability of maiming oneself so as not to be found in sin. I hope no one goes to cutoff and pluck-out his/her members today because of one sin or the other. What the passage opines helps us to understand that sin is not trivial as many consider it. Sin is weighty and not to be condoned. A grievous sin identified from that passage is that of sowing the seed that scandalizes the young person—something that has cost the church so much in her reputation-stock. A lot of people today act without knowing that we are under the radar of life and God. As Christians we are enjoined not to do things just because we can but to do things judged to be edifying of themselves and to others. Do you think about this or is it just as you think and see?
