30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our God is one who is able to reverse all human conditions. Not only that, but it was also His promise to do so. There is a song which goes this way: “Yes, my Lord is able, He’s able; My Lord is able; I know my Lord is able to carry me through.” That song went on to proclaim all that Jesus was able to do, like healing the sick, giving sight to the blind; helping people with disabilities to walk, walking upon the sea, and even raising the dead. Yes, our God was able to do them and remains able to do so today. When the prophecy came in the Old Testament many did not imagine it as factually something to expect, but those who saw it come true in the Gospel cannot stop telling the story. The Gospel account is that of one who heard all that Jesus was doing and wanted to take his turn. Did he get it? Yes. The Bible says so much that faith comes from hearing—the testimony of believers grow the hunger in non-believers to come and try Jesus—to know if he can do what they hear he is doing. Unfortunately, many of us have allowed the voice of the society to drown our power to testify. Speaking about the new era of evangelization Pope Benedict asked us to re-propose our faith to others. Tell them about Jesus and what He is able to do. The blind man heard that and tried his luck. He was discouraged from speaking but he shouted all the louder because it was his chance to take. Unfortunately, too many of us are silenced when it is our chance to take. Today we are blind, not so much physically but in our perception of the hand of grace in our world. Unless we can see, we may not be able to tell others so that they can long to see. Let’s pray that the message of Jesus can be that voice that liberates us so that we can see and tell what God has done for us that others may be encouraged to take their own chance with our all-good God who is immensely able. **Please do not forget the celebration of All Saints on Friday and the commemoration of All Souls on Saturday.
