31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

In what could be considered as part of the farewell discourse of Moses, he enjoined the people to keep the Commandments God gave them. According to him it will guarantee certain things for them: long life, growth, and prosperity in the land which God promised to give them. And considering that they were still on the way it means that the keeping of the Commandments is the guarantor of the blessings ahead. Then placing it under the canopy of love Moses meant that the greatest act of the love of God is the keeping of the Commandments. Some may be hesitant to say this but it's true because God loved first by bringing the people out of slavery and plotting their journey through the desert. Therefore, the basic Jewish catechism of loving God with every fiber of one's life, heart, strength, and soul is the least they could do in order to benefit from the blessings ahead. Jesus' response with the same catechetical line in the gospel was considered a great answer. However, it is beautiful to remember where Jesus took that answer to next. He told the man that he is not far from the kingdom of heaven. The curiosity it raised for me is this, "Do I want to end my journey in the kingdom or near the kingdom?" Surely, it is in the kingdom. Consequently, knowing the right things is one thing and doing them is another thing. So, for all who want to be in the kingdom of God they ought, not only to know, but they should be ready to love God with every fiber of their being as they continue on their pilgrimage on this side of life. Although, many in our world today speak of love while meaning different things but true love is always what I do in appreciation for what I have received. God has blessed us and so loving him is the least we can do. And as Jesus showed, love of God is as vertical as much as it is horizontal. To emphasize one over the other collapses the edifice of love. So, in this month of Thanksgiving let us demonstrate our love of God by worshipping more and show our love of neighbor by helping more to alleviate the plight of the less fortunate among us. Remember also that the month of November is marked as one when we can pray for the dead more intentionally. Fr. Uju
