32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The widow's story might be a popular Christian story, and one used by many people to explain or excuse their little contributions at occasion. But as a parable and faith story, it is more an indictment of us all about our trust in Divine Providence and if we believe that all we have and have belonged to God. Like in the first reading the widow had nothing more than she told the prophet and was getting ready to prepare it and wait for death with her Son. But hearing the words of the prophets that 'thus says the Lord, it shall not finish . . ." she gave what she had because if the Lord said so, if the Lord needed it, and since it is the Lord that gave it; she will be fine. This was the attitude of the widow in the Gospel. She understood that the little she had was God's gift and that if she gave it back to God she was not robbing herself but knocking on the door of providence. This is unlike the rich man presented in the Gospel who was giving God part of his **change** because he needed to take care of himself first. In our relations with God and attitude to Church offerings, according to a certain priest, people offer from their change and at times when they dip into their pockets and see only larger bills, they will withhold giving that week. In as much as the church has never asked us to give everything we have to God or to the Church collection basket, the question will always be about our attitude towards the giving that we are called to make. Do we think that the big bill that is in our pockets is too much for God or all we have which can't be given away? Do we deliberately give only our change? Or do we really think that God and the Church already have enough, and we don't need to give more? Whichever is the case, the Scripture tells us that when we consciously give to God cheerfully from our lack or abundance, He blesses and multiplies them for our enrichment. We cannot outdo God in generosity. So do not stop giving because you think it will be taken by the new parish structure, or your church will now have enough from the newcomers. We still have bills to pay to the end and we do not know who will really ioin us. Like the widows of our readings today, do all in demonstration of your confidence in divine providence. The God who asks from us does not impoverish us. He is rather preparing us to receive more from his abundance.
