33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time One Spiritual Master told a group of us young boys many years ago, that “That which came, will someday go.” He told us this during a tough time so that we wouldn’t give up but continue to struggle on. Ordinarily, people speak of the beginning and the end, the Alpha and Omega, etc. We see things come to their end whether it’s as a result of aging or something else. What is important is that we know that everything has an end. The way humans react to this knowledge or about any approaching incident is to adequately prepare for it. I always imagine peoples attitude to hurricane forecasts. Severally people are warned of the impending monster by watching the computer models of the sea rumblings. Some take the warning seriously, some others don’t. After its devastations, those who take the warnings seriously live to tell the story while those who do not, may not be there again to tell the story. It is the same thing that happens every day when we watch the weather channel before leaving home. Every forecast warns us indirectly how to dress, how early or late to begin our trip—while looking at some scientific models. Before technological modeling, ancients had their way of understanding weather patterns, and so warned people about how best to carry on. Today, Jesus invites us to apply the insight we gained through our consciousness of the weather pattern to heavenly realities especially the end of time. Specifically, the Gospel wants us to know that the end is near the corner and so we must be prepared to dress appropriately for it. That dressing is not the kind made of cotton, lace, silk or any other things but righteous living so that the approaching spiritual storm will find us living in a house made of the solid foundation of goodness. Are you ready for this coming? In a way we hear this as we come to the end of our liturgical season and that of parishes that have held our spiritual heritage. Imagine then of the end of all things and ask if you are prepared to meet your maker. **Fr. Uju**
