WEEKLY REFLECTION

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at New All Saints,

This week's reflection centers on the words of our Lord as recorded in Luke 6:39-45. In this passage, Jesus uses the imagery of trees and their fruit to remind us that our hearts, the very source of our words and actions, reveal our true nature. Just as a good tree cannot produce bad fruit and vice versa, so too does the condition of our inner life determine the goodness—or otherwise—that we offer to the world.

Self-Examination and Humility

Jesus challenges us with a powerful call to self-reflection. He asks us to look first at the “log” in our own eye before we are quick to notice the “speck” in our brother's eye. In our daily lives, it is all too easy to judge others without recognizing our own imperfections. Let this be a call to humility: to acknowledge that we all have areas in need of healing and transformation. Only by examining our own hearts can we grow into the disciples we are called to be.
